High Halden School Sports Premium Impact Report 2024/2025

PE and Sport at High Halden:

In keeping with our Christian ethos and school vision, all children at High Halden will leave primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to flourish in physical activity and sport.

The Sports Premium funding had been provided to ensure impact against the following objective:

“To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools. It is important to emphasise that the focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact against the vision (*above*) that will live on well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding.”

As a school, we allocate our sports premium with the aim of ensuring an improvement against the following five key indicators:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - kick-starting healthy, active lifestyles.
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching Pe and sport.
4. Broaden the experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.
